

Anthony D. Czaplicki Class of 1970

Anthony Czaplicki distinguished himself as a nationally renowned Pharmacist and as a community volunteer working with children and local school districts.

Anthony graduated from Roosevelt High School in 1970, where he participated on the football and track teams. He was a member of the National Honor Society and the Student Council and was recognized by being on numerous Honor Rolls for his scholastic efforts.

Czaplicki earned his B.S. Degree in Pharmacy at Wayne State University in 1974. His M.B.A. in Pharmacy was earned at Regis University, Denver, Colorado in 2000. In 2009, he was awarded a "Fellowship" from the National Advisory Board in Washington, D.C. Anthony has ten different State licenses as a certified Pharmacist.

Anthony Czaplicki began his professional career at Wyandotte General Hospital as Director of Pharmacy where he served for over eight years. In 1980, at Ball Memorial Hospital in Indiana, Anthony served as Director of Pharmacy for over three years. In 1985 for the State of Alabama, he was the Director of Pharmacy, Management Materials and Dietary. Anthony then accepted the position of Director of Pharmacy in Albany, Georgia at Phoebe-Putney Memorial Hospital where he worked for twelve years. In 2001, Czaplicki moved to Birmingham, Alabama where he was Director of Pharmacy at the Baptist Mt. Clair Hospital.

In 2004, Anthony and his family moved to Jacksonville, Florida, where he served as Director of Pharmacy at the Baptist Hospital System. He also was a faculty member of Florida University and Director of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation. Anthony Czapliciki is currently and adjunct Professor in Clinical Pharmacy at the Universities of Florida, Wayne State, Georgia and Samford. Anthony is also on the State Board of Pharmacy of Indiana, Georgia and Alabama. Anthony is also currently a Pharmacy

Consultant for the National Comprehensive Pharmacy Services Corporation. He recently developed a Pharmacy Residency Program at the Baptist Hospital in Jacksonville, Florida.

Anthony Czaplicki's professional career earned him many honors and recognitions. Wayne State University Kappa Psi Chapter named him "Man of the Year" in 1980. He was named "U.S. Pharmacist of the Year" in 1994 for his work and service during the devastation of Hurricane Andrew. Czaplicki has been recognized for his dedicated service in enriching the health care industry of our country.

Anthony also found time from his Pharmacy career to serve his community in numerous ways. While in Georgia, Anthony served on the local School Board and the P.T.O. He also worked as a Boy Scout Leader. While in Alabama, he coached children in Basketball, Volleyball and Soccer. Anthony also served as T-Ball League President and School Athletic Director. In 1996, Czaplicki was honored by the Boy Scouts of American with the "Leadership Award of Merit."
